To All Secretaries and Heads of Departments,

Establishment of an Insurance Scheme for Public Officers (Agrahara)

Further to Circulars Nos 05/97 and 05/97 (I) of 31.01.1997 and 01.09.1997 respectively on the above subject.

- 02. In implementing the Agrahara Insurance Scheme, agreement has been reached with the Insurance Corporation of Sri Lanka on the following matters, and you are kindly requested to take action accordingly.
 - 1. In respect of a normal child birth,
 - (a) if warded in a Government Hospital payment for the relevant period will be at the rate of Rs. 250/- per day. This payment is subject to a maximum of Rs. 3000/-
 - (b) If warded in a private hospital payment will be at the rate of Rs. 25/- per day or the amount shown in the bill in respect of the number of days warded in the hospital. This payment is also subject to a maximum of Rs. 3000/-
 - 03. Except on a certificate issued by a Specialist Eye Surgeon no reimbursement will be made in respect of expenses incurred for spectacles obtained on other certificates.
 - 04. Relevant claims should be forwarded to the prescribed office of the Sri Lanka Insurance Corporation within 90 days of obtaining out-door treatment or being admitted to a hospital.
 - 05. Complaints are being received regarding the prevailing delays in dealing with the Public Officers' Insurance Scheme. Therefore, action should be taken to prevent such situations.
