To: All Secretaries to Ministries, Heads of Departments, Chief Secretaries to Provincial Councils, Secretaries to Governors, Secretaries to Provincial Public Service Commissions and Government Agents.

Public Officers elected to Local Government Bodies and Provincial Councils

Chapter XXXII of the Establishments Code which was amended by the Public Administration Circular No. 1/89 dated 05.01.1989 is further amended as follows:

02. Delete sub sections 2:3:4 & 3:7 and substitute the following therefore:-

"2:3:4 If he is elected as a member of a Local Government he will required to resign his post in the Body, not be Public Service. but will subject to the exigencies of service. be given leave of absence on full pay to attend meetings of the Local Government Body.

If a Public Officer is elected as a member of Provincial Council he will be allowed to avail himself of either of the following options:

Option 1. He should be released on full time basis, enabling him to serve as a member of the Provincial Council on no pay leave, so long as he continues as a member of the Provincial Council.

- Option 2. He should be deemed to have left the Public Service on his being selected, subject to the following conditions.
 - (i) If at the time of his election to the Provincial Council his substantive post in the Pubic Service was a post declared to be pensionable under the minutes on pensions then,
 - (a) he shall be eligible for such awards under the pension minutes as might have been made to him if he had retired from the Public Service on the abolition of office on the date of his election to the council:

- (b) however such retirement benefits shall not be paid to him unless his service to the Provincial Council has been terminated on his ceasing to be a member of the council;
- (c) in the event of his death while in the service of the Provincial Council the retirement benefits should be paid to his dependents considering he died the previous day of the election to the council.
- (ii) If at the time of his election to the Provincial Council he was a contributor to the Public Service Provident Fund under the Public Service Provident Fund Ordinance, he shall for the purpose of that Ordinance be seemed to have left the service of the Government upon the termination of his contract with the consent of the Government otherwise than by dismissal, and
- (iii) If before the time of his election to the council, he had entered into a contract with the Government, by which he had agreed to serve the Government for a specified period, any period of service to the council will be regarded as service to the Government for the purpose of discharging any obligation of such a contract."
 - "3:7 If an officer who is entitled to exercise political rights is elected a member of a Local Government Body allowed the concession should be of serving station close to the office of the Local Government Body to which he is elected, subject to the exigencies of service and disciplinary requirements. He will not be subject to the normal transfers as long as he continues to be a member of that provincial Councils or Local Government Body."
- 03. These provisions are effective from 27.04.1988.
